

**An Invitation to Presenters to Submit to the
*Proceedings of the Western Society for French History***

We invite participants of the Boulder, Colorado, meeting of the WSFH to submit revised versions of their papers for publication in the *Proceedings of the Western Society for French History*. The *Proceedings* are peer reviewed in a process that involves:

- 1) recommendations by panel chairs and commentators about a paper's suitability for publication;
- 2) the judgment of the editors;
- 3) in some cases, recommendations from an editorial board.

Even if you are considering submitting but have not yet decided, we urge you to request your chair and commentator to submit assessments of your paper to us. If you have definitely decided not to submit, please inform your chair or commentator in order to spare them unnecessary work.

The WSFH style sheet and evaluation forms for chairs and commentators are in this packet and are also available at the Society's web site, <http://www.wsfh.org>. Deadline for submission is **1 January 2010**. Papers may be submitted electronically or by post. All submissions coming through the mail must include both a hard copy of the paper and a computer disk with the paper in Word 6.0 or higher. When you submit your article, please make sure that you fill out and send by surface mail to Donna Ryan (address above) a copy of the SPO-WSFH copyright form. Upon receipt, we will fill out the last box regarding "Journal Representative."

The *Proceedings*, published since 1974, has now moved to a primarily online format with the Scholarly Publishing Office at the University of Michigan Library, although the WSFH is now investigating the possibility of print-on-demand. Volumes 31–35 (papers from the Newport Beach [2003], Lubbock [2004], Colorado Springs [2005], Long Beach [2006], and Albuquerque [2007] meetings) are available through our own website, www.wsfh.org, and at <http://www.hti.umich.edu/w/wsfh>. Volume 36 for the Quebec 2008 meeting will be available online soon. The *Proceedings* are indexed in *Historical Abstracts*; *America: History and Life*; *PapersFirst*; and *ProceedingsFirst*. We are also currently in the process of digitizing the entire run of *Proceedings* published before online publication. With the *Proceedings* available online and free of charge, we hope that our readership will increase significantly. We have sent a notice to all subscriber libraries, but we hope that you will remind your university library to link the *Proceedings* site to its catalogue.

We look forward to an excellent meeting in Boulder, Colorado, and to receiving many of your articles this winter. We'd also like to thank all the chairs and commentators in advance for their assessment of their panels.
