COPYRIGHT INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

Effective January 1978, United States copyright law requires explicit transfer of copyright from author to publisher to enable the publisher to have consistent copyright protection and the right to disseminate the author's work. Therefore, the following agreement, executed and signed by the author, is required with each manuscript.

If you wish your paper to be considered for publication, complete the following "transfer of copyright agreement."

TRANSFER OF COPYRIGHT AGREEMENT

1. My article entitled:

is herewith submitted for publication in volume 36 of the *Proceedings* of the annual meeting of the Western Society for French History. It has not been published previously. If and when the article is accepted for publication I, as author, hereby agree to transfer to the Western Society for French History all rights under existing copyright laws except for the following:

- (i) the rights to reproduce, distribute, publicly perform, and publicly display the Article in any medium for non-commercial purposes;
- (ii) the right to prepare derivative works from the Article; and
- (iii) the right to authorize others to make any noncommercial use of the Article so long as Author receives credit as author and the journal in which the Article has been published is cited as the source of first publication of the Article. For example, Author may make and distribute copies in the course of teaching and research and may post the Article on personal or institutional Web sites and in other open-access digital repositories.

As author, I agree that copies made under these circumstances, including translations and adaptations, will carry the copyright notice that appeared in the original published work, the *Proceedings* of the annual meeting of the Western Society for French History.
